





WindSpd(Kts) & WindDir For Mon Apr 13 2020 5PM EDT




## Monday: Wind Advisory Today

Another windy day expected for the Borderland, with wind 25-35 mph, gusts to 45 mph possible today. A Wind Advisory has been issued for parts of southern New Mexico and west Texas. In addition to windy conditions, patchy areas of blowing dust will be possible during the afternoon hours. East slopes of the Franklin and Organ mountains will feature the strongest and longest lasting winds. Time of highest wind gusts will be late this afternoon. Wind will begin to slowly decrease after dark, but will remain elevated through midnight.







# Fire Activity (\*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 76 (no change) fires and 9,595 (no change) acres destroyed this year. There are 69 (no change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list 35 (+1) counties with an average over 400.
