- **Elevated to critical fire weather conditions across S NM and W TX on Thursday.**
- **Moderate to major river flooding continues on the MS River, but most points have crested and will remain steady or begin a slow fall.**



5-Day Precipitation Forecast & River Flood Status



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Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall



Moderate to major flooding continues along the MS River. Most locations have crested and will remain steady or being a slow fall.

- **Major flooding is occurring near Baton Rouge, LA crested around 44 ft. Shipping and industrial activities significantly affected.**
- **The Bonnet Carré Floodway continues to operate and reduce flow at New Orleans, LA, maintaining 17.0ft (minor) flood stage through this week. Impacts to navigation. A 20 ft project levee protects the city.**

The Atchafalaya River at Morgan City, LA will maintain moderate flood stage through this weekend. Some flooding of buildings possible.



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
