





An isolated storm or two may develop late in the day over or close to western north Texas and southwest Oklahoma. Large hail and damaging wind gusts would be the concerns with any storm that does develop.




The central and eastern Permian Basin, Lower Trans Pecos/Stockton Plateau, and portions of Brewster county are under a Marginal Risk for severe weather this afternoon into this evening. Large hail and damaging wind gusts are the primary concerns, along with frequent lightning. Plan ahead if you have outdoor plans later today!







Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 87 (+2) fires and 28,851 (+7) acres destroyed this year. There are 64 (-2) counties with burn bans. The Keetch-Byram Drought Index list 51 (+1) counties with an average over 400.
