






WindSpd(Kts) & WindDir For Thu May 14 2020 5PM EDT

# Hazardous Weather



Strong to severe storms possible, but they will be highly conditional. Storms will likely form east in Oklahoma, but will they be able to get going in the Texas and Oklahoma Panhandles first? The cap is strong most of the day, but may break after 4 PM and allow for some isolated storms to pop up. If a storm develops, it could certainly go severe, but would not be in the Panhandles for very long.



A strong storm or two is possible across the Lower Trans Pecos and the far eastern parts of Scurry and Mitchell Counties this afternoon and early evening. There is a greater risk of severe storms on Friday when damaging hail and winds, localized flooding, low visibilities, and cloud to ground lightning are possible.


Dry conditions with above normal temperatures will contribute to elevated fire weather conditions today. Be careful with sparks, stow chains properly, and do not drive into tall grass.





# Fire Activity (\*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 115 (+2) fires and 30,128 (+145) acres destroyed this year. There are 71 (-1) counties with burn bans. The Keetch-Byram Drought Index list 52 (-9) counties with an average over 400.
