
Hazardous Weather



Scattered to Numerous Showers and Thunderstorms will move across Deep South Texas and the RGV this morning. Some locally heavy rainfall will be possible throughout the morning hours possibly resulting in additional localized flooding problems.

A Flash Flood Watch is in effect until 7 pm Wednesday for portions of the Arklatex. On top of already saturated soils, additional rainfall amounts of 1 to 2 inches with locally higher amounts will be possible. Flood prone and poor drainage areas will be vulnerable to flooding at this time.






