



Wind Speeds







Hazardous Weather



Expect mostly cloudy skies across the area today. There will be a chance for showers and thunderstorms across the western half of the area this afternoon and evening. Some storms could be strong to severe producing large hail and damaging wind gusts. High temperatures will range from the middle 80s to the middle 90s.

There is a Slight Risk for severe thunderstorms today and tonight for the western Brush Country to the Rio Grande. Although some strong or severe storms are possible as early as this afternoon, severe storms are more likely this evening and overnight. Damaging wind gusts and large hail could develop.

Hazardous Weather



Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms should develop this afternoon, with the greatest chances favoring areas along and west of the Brush Country where some severe thunderstorms may develop. Highs will range from the mid 80s along the coast to the low and mid 90s farther inland under partly cloudy skies.

Showers and thunderstorms should expand in coverage tonight, especially from the Brush Country to the Rio Grande where severe thunderstorms will be possible. Lows under mostly cloudy skies will be in the 70s with winds becoming northeasterly overnight.




Precipitation Chances Today






Keetch-Byram Drought Index


Keetch-Byram Drought Index
