



Tropical Weather Awareness



For the North Atlantic...Caribbean Sea and the Gulf of Mexico: The National Hurricane Center is issuing advisories on Tropical Storm Cristobal, centered over the central Gulf of Mexico. An area of low pressure is expected to develop along a cold front a few hundred miles east or northeast of Bermuda by the middle of next week. Some development of this system is possible while it moves northwestward or west-northwestward over the western Atlantic. * Formation chance through 48 hours...low...near 0 percent. * Formation chance through 5 days...low...20 percent.







Minor coastal flooding with around one foot inundation will occur this morning and again Sunday morning for islands along and south of Port Aransas. A Coastal Flood Advisory is in effect through 11 AM Sunday. There is a HIGH rip current risk this afternoon through Sunday for all Gulf-facing beaches.


Minor coastal flooding is likely along the lower Texas coast near high tide on Saturday at 7:06 AM. In addition, dangerous rip currents and rough surf are likely to develop late tonight and continue through the rest of the weekend. Narrow beaches will become impassable late tonight through Saturday afternoon especially north of public beach access number 3. Driving on the beach is not recommended.





Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 130 (+1) fires and 39,487 (+5) acres destroyed this year. There are 71 (no change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch – Byram Drought Index list 33 (-1) counties with an average over 400.
