





# Hazardous Weather



High Temperatures will be near or break records for today with readings from 98 to 104 degrees. The record in Lubbock for today is 103 and is forecast to be tied, the record in Childress is 107 and should not be broken.



Critical fire weather conditions are expected west of a Dimmitt to Brownfield line with elevated conditions for counties along Interstate 27 and U.S. 87. Outdoor burning is strongly discouraged!




Today will see record-breaking temperatures. Breezy and dry conditions in the mountains and adjacent plains will cause critical fire weather conditions. Isolated thunderstorms are possible in the very far east of our region this afternoon and early evening.

# Hazardous Weather



Temperatures continue to cool down in the Borderland. Most of the area will be below the triple digits with max temperatures near average for the season. The weather continues to be dry, and with stronger west winds expected in the afternoon which will lead to high fire danger across the area. Therefore, there is a Red Flag Warning in effect from noon to 8 PM.



Another mostly sunny and very warm day for South-Central Texas. Temperatures will rise into the upper 90s to mid 100s. Winds will gradually become southwesterly by this afternoon. A stray shower could make it to far western Val Verde county late this evening but remaining dry everywhere else.







## Forecast Fire Danger






# Keetch-Byram Drought Index

# Fire Activity (\*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 130 (no change) fires and 39,487 (no change) acres destroyed this year. There are 71 (no change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch – Byram Drought Index list 40 (+5) counties with an average over 400.
