




Hazardous Weather




Thunderstorms are expected to move southeast from the mountains and higher terrain of southern Colorado and northern New Mexico. The timing for the storms today will be from around late this afternoon or 4 PM today through about 1 AM Tuesday. Best chances of organized severe storms will be across the western and central Texas and Oklahoma Panhandles. Damaging wind and large hail will be the main threats with these storms.

Severe weather will be possible this evening into tonight as storms move southeast from New Mexico into the Texas panhandle. Damaging winds and large hail will be the main threat with these storms.

Hazardous Weather



Heat Advisory is in effect this afternoon and evening across much of the region. Excessive Heat Warning is in effect for Central Brewster County as well for the same time frame. Most areas will eclipse 100 degrees today with some areas even topping 110F! Stay cool out there everyone, and be sure to drink plenty of fluids!



Monday will see very high temperatures, with nearly every location in the triple digits! Please try to avoid outdoor activities and make sure to drink plenty of water. A severe thunderstorm or two will be possible across the Northeast Permian Basin late afternoon and early evening.

Hazardous Weather



Severe weather will be possible this afternoon and tonight, mainly across the area north of a Barnhart to Brady to San Saba line. The main severe weather threats are damaging winds and large hail, along with deadly lightning.



The first complex of overnight storms has weakened and is exiting to the east. Meanwhile, a second cluster of storms will continue moving southeast through the morning hours while gradually dissipating. Heavy rain will be the main concern and may cause some localized flooding issues.

Hazardous Weather



There will be another chance for severe thunderstorms again on Monday, over much of southern and western Oklahoma and western north Texas.




Heavy rain could lead to flooding in some locations this evening and overnight.





Keetch-Byram Drought Index


