



Tropical Weather Awareness








WindSpd(Kts) & WindDir For Tue Jun 30 2020 5PM EDT



Dry grasses and shrubs across the Texas and Oklahoma Panhandles with low relative humidity values and breezy winds will create critical fire weather conditions today.


The highlighted area is where near critical to critical fire weather conditions exist Tuesday afternoon.

The combination of warm to hot temperatures and high humidity will produce dangerous heat conditions this afternoon for the inland Coastal Bend and western Brush Country. Afternoon heat index values will range from 110 to 113 across these areas. The afternoon heat index will range from 105 to 109 for the rest of south Texas. Residents with outdoor activities planned are urged to drink plenty of water, wear light weight and light colored clothing and take frequent breaks from the heat.







Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 212 (+2) fires and 61,258 (+20) acres destroyed this year. There are 85 (no change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list 85 (+3) counties with an average over 400.
