





Temperatures won't be as hot today as they have been the past few days, but it will still be HOT. Highs will be mostly in the middle to upper 90s, though a few triple digits will be possible, primarily up around Childress. The heat, along with a dryline, will help cause scattered thunderstorms to develop across the Caprock this afternoon. A few of these storms could briefly become strong, producing small hail, gusty winds and heavy downpours.


A few severe storms will be possible this afternoon and evening. Damaging wind gusts will be the primary threat.

This is most likely to occur from the Metroplex westward. Storm chances are around 20%.


Hot with Storms by Afternoon







Keetch-Byram Drought Index



Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 220 (+5) fires and 61,565 (+122) acres destroyed this year. There are 86 (no change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list 102 (+7) counties with an average over 400.
