











Keetch-Byram Drought Index



Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 220 (no change) fires and 61,565 (no change) acres destroyed this year. There are 86 (no change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list 106 (+4) counties with an average over 400.
