There is a Marginal Risk (level 1/5) for severe weather this afternoon and this evening, mainly for portions of Lea county and the Permian Basin, though storms will be possible across most of the region. The primary threat with storms that develop will be damaging winds, though heavy rain and lightning could accompany any storm. Plan ahead if you'll be outdoors later today!

# Hazardous Weather



An isolated severe storm is possible this afternoon and evening, with the main severe threat of damaging winds.



Hot and humid conditions will continue with Heat index values in the triple digits. Showers and thunderstorms are possible mainly across the eastern half of the CWA.







Reports 223 (no change) fires and 61,593 (no change) acres destroyed this year. There are 86 (no change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list 121 (+5) counties with an average over 400.
