





Hazardous Weather



A few storms could move into the western Panhandles this evening. The primary threat will be lightning and gusty outflow winds up to 50 mph. Small hail and localized heavy rain can't be ruled out, along with very isolated wind gusts around 50 to 60 mph.



Thunderstorms are possible today and tonight. Any storms that do develop will be accompanied by frequent lightning, small hail, gusty winds, and brief, heavy rainfall. Otherwise, above-normal temperatures are expected!

Rain/Storm Chances & Forecast High Temperatures



Rain/storm chances will continue today across the region. The best chances are mainly along and south of the I-20 corridor. Locally heavy rainfall and frequent lightning are the main threats.

High temperatures will range from the mid 80s to near 90 degrees.



Scattered showers and thunderstorms will be possible today across North and Central Texas. The best chances for rain will be along and south of the I-20 corridor. Heavy rain and lightning will be possible with any storms. With increased cloud cover, temperatures will be a bit cooler, ranging from the mid 80s in the northeast to near 90 further south and west.

Hazardous Weather



There are slight chances of showers and thunderstorms mainly across northern and eastern parts of South Central Texas today. Otherwise, partly cloudy skies will prevail. Temperatures will be up to 3 degrees above normal with highs ranging from the lower 90s in the Hill Country to near 100 along the Rio Grande. Elevated heat index values are expected.




Tuesday will be another very warm day with a chance for afternoon and evening thunderstorms. Best rain chances will be east of the Rio Grande. Our high temperatures on Tuesday will be a few degrees below Monday's highs. The winds will be light and from the east.





Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 230 (+7) fires and 67,161 (+5,568) acres destroyed this year. There are 86 (no change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list 123 (-7) counties with an average over 400.
