




WindSpd(Kts) & WindDir For Sat Jul 11 2020 5PM EDT







Another warm and humid day is expected with high temperatures close to or above 100 degrees. Heat Advisories are in effect from 11 AM through 8 PM CDT.


The combination of hot temperatures and high humidity will produce dangerous heat conditions this afternoon across South Texas. Afternoon heat index values of 110 to 114 can be expected. The afternoon heat index will range from 105 to 109 across the islands. Residents with outdoor activities planned are urged to drink plenty of water, wear light weight and light colored clothing and take frequent breaks from the heat.






Anomalous Hot Conditions Continue

Strong high pressure overhead will result in the hottest temperatures so far this year. High temperatures will be between 105- 100 degrees for most of the area, and overnight lows will remain warm and provide little relief from the heat. An Excessive Heat Warning is in effect for portions of El Paso county through at least early Sunday, with a Heat Advisory through early Monday across much of the rest of the area (excluding area mountains). Take precautions to limit exposure to this heat as most everyone will be susceptible to heat exhaustion and stroke.








