



Hazardous Weather




Scattered thunderstorms are expected to develop late this afternoon and evening. The best chance for severe storms is expected to be in the evening hours, however any storms that develop in the afternoon will have potential to become severe. Large hail and damaging winds will be the main threats in addition to dangerous lighting and heavy downpours. Land spouts can't be ruled out.




High temperatures of 105 to 110 degrees are expected again this afternoon.

Record breaking heat will continue today across west Texas and southeast New Mexico. Heat Advisories and Excessive Heat Warnings are in effect today through at least Monday evening.




Strong upper high pressure persists over New Mexico, continuing our very hot trend. Many sites will once again threaten their daily high temperature records. An Excessive Heat Warning remains in effect the El Paso metro area Sunday, while Heat Advisories remain in effect for most of the other lowland desert sites.

Hazardous Weather



A Heat Advisory is in effect today until 8 PM this evening for all of South Texas except islands along the Middle Texas Coast. High heat indices of 110 to 114 degrees are likely. Stay hydrated and take frequent breaks if you must be outdoors.



A Heat Advisory is in effect for all of Deep South Texas and the Rio Grande Valley from 1 PM CDT to 6 PM CDT today. Expect heat index values up to 115 degrees for the advisory area. Drink plenty of fluids, stay in an air-conditioned room, stay out of the sun, and check up on relatives and neighbors. Young children and pets should never be left unattended in vehicles under any circumstances.


Heat advisory remains in effect from 11 am this morning to 7 pm CDT this evening. Heat index values up to 112 expected. Portions of central, south central, southwest and west central Louisiana and southeast Texas. From 11 AM to 7 PM CDT Sunday. Hot temperatures and high humidity may cause heat illnesses.





Keetch-Byram Drought Index



Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 236 (no change) fires and 67,622 (no change) acres destroyed this year. There are 91 (+2) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list 149 (+8) counties with an average over 400.
