




# Tropical Weather Awareness



A tropical wave is producing a large area of disorganized showers and thunderstorms over the eastern Gulf of Mexico, central and southern Florida, and western Cuba. Gradual development of this system is possible while it moves west-northwestward, and a tropical depression could form during the next few days. This disturbance is expected to move over the central Gulf today, and reach the northwestern Gulf on Thursday and Friday. An Air Force Reserve Hurricane Hunter aircraft is scheduled to investigate the system later today, if necessary. Formation chance through 48 hours...medium...40 percent. Formation chance through 5 days...medium...50 percent.






## Slight Chance of Showers/Thunderstorms This Evening






Active weather continues across southern New Mexico and far west Texas. On Wednesday, we are expecting numerous showers and thunderstorms over area mountains, while isolated to scattered activity is expected on the lowlands. Some locations may have periods of heavy rain that could lead to minor flooding of low lying areas. Gusty winds and small hail are possible with any storm. Temperatures will be slightly cooler, just a degree or so lower than on Tuesday, but that is still above average for the season. Skies will be partly to mostly cloudy in the afternoon.




# Keetch-Byram Drought Index

## Keetch-Byram Drought Index


