







- A few thunderstorms may be strong to severe, with damaging wind gusts being the main hazard. Frequent cloud-to-ground lightning strikes and locally heavy rainfall will also be possible.
- Otherwise, look for lows in the 70s and increasing cloud cover.

Shower and thunderstorm chances will increase tonight ahead of an approaching cold front. The highest rain chances will be across North Texas, particularly near the Red River. A few thunderstorms could be strong to severe, and produce damaging wind gusts. Locally heavy rainfall and frequent cloud-to-ground lightning strikes will also be possible. Otherwise, look for low temperatures in the 70s and increasing cloudiness.



# Hazardous Weather




Showers and thunderstorms are expected to last into the early morning hours on Friday. Low temperatures will be in the mid 60s and low 70s Friday.



Much of the N Permian Basin and Lea County, NM are under a marginal risk for severe weather today. This means that these areas will see isolated severe storms, with strong wind gusts and frequent lightning as the main concerns. Some isolated large hail cannot be ruled out as well.






