

WindSpd(Kts) & WindDir For Sun Aug 02 2020 5PM EDT








Strong to severe thunderstorms are possible today across southeast New Mexico, the Guadalupe Mountains, and the far NW Permian Basin.

Low level moisture will persist Sunday, allowing scattered thunderstorms to develop in the afternoon once again. Sunny skies in the early afternoon should allow temperatures to warm above normal.

Hazardous Weather



A lingering upper level low pressure trough and plenty of moisture in place will provide the Mid and Lower Valley another chance of showers and thunderstorms this afternoon. One or two of the thunderstorms could drop 1 to 2 inches of rain in a short time producing some localized flooding of streets and low-lying areas. Temperatures should reach early August normals with heat indices topping 100 degrees in many locations. Marine conditions remain favorable with light winds and slight seas.




