



Thunderstorms will be possible across the southern Texas Panhandle during the afternoon and evening hours. A couple storms could be strong to severe with damaging wind gusts the main threat.

Mostly sunny and seasonably hot, with showers and thunderstorms approaching from the west late this afternoon and through the evening hours.

Hazardous Weather



Mild temperatures overnight with scattered showers and thunderstorms, that are expected to move across the state line from New Mexico this evening, tapering off after midnight.




Storm coverage in the afternoon is expected to be less than previous days as high pressure aloft suppresses rain chances. The best rain chances will be limited to the Black Range and Sacramento Mountains, with only slight and spotty chances across the lowlands. Strong wind gusts may occur from some of the storms. Temperatures will be slightly above normal with a few triple-digit highs likely around El Paso. Winds away from storms will be light at 5 to 10 mph.





Keetch-Byram Drought Index


