





Hazardous Weather



Isolated storms are possible across the west and southwest Panhandles with storms moving south southeast. There will be two possible rounds of storms with the first being from 4 PM to 10 PM starting anywhere across the western half of the Panhandles and moving south southeast. The second round will be from 10 PM to 4 AM and come into the northwest and move south southeast across the western half of the Panhandles. The main threat with storms today will be gusty winds and small hail, but a few storms may become severe with damaging wind gusts possible.




Partly cloudy skies and hot daytime temperatures are in store for much of Deep South Texas today. Isolated showers and thunderstorms are possible this afternoon and early evening mainly across western areas and across the northern ranchlands. Favorable marine conditions are also anticipated due to light winds.




There is a slight chance for thunderstorms tonight, mainly across the extreme southern Panhandle and the Rolling Plains. Lows will mostly be in the 60s.







Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 392 (+41) fires and 106,860 (+6,606) acres destroyed this year. There are 136 (no change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list 230 (no change) counties with an average over 400.
