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FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Sunday August 30, 2020

Disclaimer: The purpose of this briefing is to provide a **Regional** weather threat assessment and is meant as a general overview. County/Parish decision makers should consult their local NWS forecast offices for the latest detailed, local weather information.

- **Active weather pattern over the next week; severe storms and heavy rain/flash flooding possible each day, especially across OK TX and AR.**
- **Heat advisories in effect across TX & LA today.**
 - Heat likely to continue over TX through Tuesday.
- **A few river points in SW LA are in or forecast to rise into moderate flood stage in the coming days.**
- **Several tropical waves coming off the African coast will need to be monitored over the next week; not expecting any near-term (within 5 days) threats to Region 6, some development possible in the eastern Atlantic next weekend.**






5-Day Precipitation Forecast & River Flood Status



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Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall



Louisiana:

- Bayou Des Cannes near Eunice is in moderate flood; a few structures near the bayou may be threatened.
- The Mermentau River at Mermentau is rising and expected to be near moderate flood stage on Tuesday; at the expected crest, flooding of the shipyard begins, portions of Castex Landing and LA 3166 become flooded and impassible.
- Several other locations in SW LA will remain in minor flood through the next several days.

The Ouachita and White Rivers in AR are in or expected to rise into minor flood stage due to expected rainfall in the next several days.

The rain expected (mostly Tuesday) over OK, AR and NTX will be mostly beneficial, a few river points may rise into minor flood, but no widespread flooding expected.








Days 4-5 Weather Hazards

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Severe storms, as well as heavy rain/flash flooding possible each day.




