



Strong to severe storms across most of the Panhandles





The thunderstorms Saturday evening could possibly inhibit the development of storms later today through tonight. If storms do develop, they could become strong to severe with all hazard types in play. Also, localized heavy rainfall can result in flooding issues.

Thunderstorms will be possible this afternoon across southern Oklahoma and north Texas. Through the afternoon, storm chances are around 20 percent, but will increase in the evening.




Sunday will be hot with high temperatures near and around the 100 degrees mark area wide. During the late evening and overnight another round of rain showers and thunderstorms is possible.



High pressure will weaken its influence over the area while moisture increases. This will lead to highs ticking downwards and rain chances ticking upwards with scattered mountain and isolated lowland storms possible.

Hot temperatures again Sunday will see widespread readings of 100 degrees or more. Chance of storms in the afternoon for parts of the forecast area.




Still Hot...Storm chances along/north of the I-20

What: Isolated to scattered showers and storms.

Where: Mainly along the northeast counties, but possible anywhere along/north of the I-20.

Another hot day with highs in the 90s near the Red River and low 100s elsewhere.

It will be still hot Sunday, but not at near record levels like Friday and Saturday. A weak surface front or old outflow boundary will slide into the Red River Valley. This may help focus a few storms across that area through the day. A few could be strong with gusty and erratic outflow winds. Highs will range from the 90s along the Red River to around 100 degrees elsewhere. Stay hydrated!

A Heat Advisory is in effect for much of the area from 10 am CDT to 7 pm CDT. Dangerous afternoon heat indices of 103 to 108 degrees are expected. Make sure to stay hydrated and practice heat safety.







Reports 452 (+5) fires and 123,894 (+4800) acres destroyed this year. There are 145 (no change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list 236 (+1) counties with an average over 400.
