**STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION:** On September 15, Governor Abbott announced that the Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) has received federal approval to automatically provide replacement benefits for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) recipients for food lost or destroyed due to Hurricane Laura in eight of the impacted counties: Hardin, Jefferson, Newton, Orange, Sabine, San Augustine, Shelby and Tyler. Those eight counties met federal criteria for mass replacements of benefits based on the severity of storm impacts in their area.

FEMA has approved the emergency declaration for the State of Texas (FEMA-3540-EM) for the counties of Anderson, Angelina, Aransas, Bexar, Bowie, Brazoria, Calhoun, Cameron, Camp, Cass, Chambers, Cherokee, Dallas, Ellis, Fort Bend, Franklin, Galveston, Gregg, Grimes, Hardin, Harris, Harrison, Houston, Jackson, Jasper, Jefferson, Kenedy, Kleberg, Leon, Liberty, Madison, Marion, Matagorda, Montgomery, Morris, Nacogdoches, Newton, Nueces, Orange, Panola, Polk, Red River, Refugio, Rusk, Sabine, San Augustine, San Jacinto, San Patricio, Shelby, Smith, Tarrant, Titus, Travis, Trinity, Tyler, Upshur, Victoria, Walker, Waller, Wharton, Willacy and Wood for reimbursement for eligible emergency protective measures (Category B), limited to direct Federal assistance and reimbursement for mass care including evacuation and shelter support.

**OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:**

1. Recovery
2. Sheltering and Mass Care
3. Accurate Damage assessments
4. Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
5. Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

## RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS

### **Texas Division of Emergency Management, Texas A&M University System (TDEM):**

The State of Texas State Operations Center (SOC) remains at Readiness Level II Escalated Response Conditions. The Daily Operations staff continues to process disaster declarations, letters to the Governor, Disaster Summary Outlines, State of Texas Assistance Requests (STARs), as well as disseminating severe weather messages, preparing Snapshots and the State SITREP. The State Management Team (SMT) continues conducting operations in the alternate State Operations Center, working together with activated members of the State's Emergency Management Council. TDEM District Coordinators are working closely with their local emergency management partners to assist with any unmet needs and resources.

**TDEM Mass Care:** TDEM Mass Care continues to coordinate the state-supported non-congregate shelter mission. Evacuees remain in non-congregate shelters throughout the state. TDEM is working with the state of Louisiana on the repopulation of their residents that sought shelter in Texas.

[2,744 evacuees are in shelters throughout the state in 1,176 hotel rooms at 11 non-congregate shelters. TDEM is working in coordination with Louisiana on the sheltering and repopulation for their residents in Texas.](#)

Currently there are six buses on standby for repopulation and they will be assisting with the re-registration of shelter residents that need transportation assistance.

### **Volunteer Organizations Active in Disaster (VOADs):**

**American Red Cross (ARC):** The ARC is providing dormitory management to multiple non-congregate hotel shelters across the state. [Between September 16 and September 17, there were 11 non-congregate shelters with 1,176 rooms occupied by 2,744 clients.](#)

**Southern Baptists of Texas Convention (SBTC):** SBTC IMT is working out of the Liberty Baptist Church in Bridge City. SBTC to date, has provided: [1,178](#) showers, [787](#) loads of laundry, [337](#) homes completed, [395](#) total requests received, [174](#) generator hours, [144](#) heavy equipment hours, [11,010](#) total meals prepared and [11,680](#) volunteer hours.

### **Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ):**

Drinking Water Systems: Drinking Water System Assessment data pulled from the Natural Disaster Operations Workgroup (NDOW) Response Manager Database as of 2:00 PM [Thursday, September 17, 2020.](#)

Phone assessments are being conducted for 171 drinking water systems in seven counties including: Hardin, Jasper, Jefferson, Newton, Orange, Sabine and San Augustine.

- Of the 171 systems assessed, 160 are operational and one is operating on a generator.
- [16](#) systems are under a Boil Water Notice and [39](#) have been rescinded.

TCEQ is periodically conducting Visible Emissions and Odor Surveys in Jefferson and Orange Counties. No issues have been noted. The TCEQ ER contractor (CTEH) completed air monitoring operations in the areas of facilities that were restarting operations and has been demobilized from the site. The TCEQ's Mobile Air Monitoring Van has been demobilized and has returned to Austin.

Ambient Monitoring Stations: One station (Orange 1<sup>st</sup> Street) is without power. The power pole at the Orange 1<sup>st</sup> Street station was replaced and is awaiting inspection before power to the site can be restored.

Twelve Temporary Debris Management Sites (TDMS) in Newton, Orange, Sabine, and Jasper Counties have been authorized. TCEQ staff are conducting weekly inspections on all of the approved Temporary Debris Management Sites.

**Texas Military Department (TMD):** TMD currently has 149 activated personnel in support of the August tropical weather response. TMD is supporting multiple shelter sites with ETN operations in the DFW Metroplex Area, Austin, Spring and The Woodlands.
