





Minor Coastal Flooding Until Around Sunrise Saturday

The greatest potential for coastal flooding will occur around the times of high tide: 4:43 AM CDT and 4:27 PM CDT today, and 4:38 AM CDT Saturday.

IMPACTS: Nuisance flooding is expected, with water reaching or pushing into the dunes. Vehicles will be unable to drive on the beach. Minor to moderate beach erosion is expected.

Minor coastal flooding is anticipated at the beaches of South Padre Island and at Boca Chica Beach due to a combination of above normal astronomical high tides and building seas in association with a tropical depression over the southwestern Gulf of Mexico.

Locally Heavy Rainfall and Minor Flooding Possible



Low pressure in the mid-layers of the atmosphere and plenty of tropical moisture in place to produce another round of showers and thunderstorms today. Some of the rainfall will be heavy at times producing the potential for localized street and low-lying flooding. Temperatures remain slightly below normal with plenty of clouds and the passing showers and thunderstorms. Marine areas steadily deteriorate today with numerous showers and thunderstorms.







Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 489 (+1) fires and 134,863 (+232) acres destroyed this year. There are 93 (-4) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list is 138 (+5) counties with an average over 400.
