**STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION:** On September 15, Governor Abbott announced that the Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) has received federal approval to automatically provide replacement benefits for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) recipients for food lost or destroyed due to Hurricane Laura in eight of the impacted counties: Hardin, Jefferson, Newton, Orange, Sabine, San Augustine, Shelby and Tyler. Those eight counties met federal criteria for mass replacements of benefits based on the severity of storm impacts in their area.

FEMA has approved the emergency declaration for the State of Texas (FEMA-3540-EM) for the counties of Anderson, Angelina, Aransas, Bexar, Bowie, Brazoria, Calhoun, Cameron, Camp, Cass, Chambers, Cherokee, Dallas, Ellis, Fort Bend, Franklin, Galveston, Gregg, Grimes, Hardin, Harris, Harrison, Houston, Jackson, Jasper, Jefferson, Kenedy, Kleberg, Leon, Liberty, Madison, Marion, Matagorda, Montgomery, Morris, Nacogdoches, Newton, Nueces, Orange, Panola, Polk, Red River, Refugio, Rusk, Sabine, San Augustine, San Jacinto, San Patricio, Shelby, Smith, Tarrant, Titus, Travis, Trinity, Tyler, Upshur, Victoria, Walker, Waller, Wharton, Willacy and Wood for reimbursement for eligible emergency protective measures (Category B), limited to direct Federal assistance and reimbursement for mass care including evacuation and shelter support.

**OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:**

1. Recovery
2. Sheltering and Mass Care
3. Accurate Damage assessments
4. Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
5. Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

## RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS

### **Texas Division of Emergency Management, Texas A&M University System (TDEM):**

The State of Texas State Operations Center (SOC) remains at Readiness Level II Escalated Response Conditions. The Daily Operations staff continues to process disaster declarations, letters to the Governor, Disaster Summary Outlines, State of Texas Assistance Requests (STARs), as well as disseminating severe weather messages, preparing Snapshots and the State SITREP. The State Management Team (SMT) continues conducting operations in the alternate State Operations Center, working together with activated members of the State's Emergency Management Council. TDEM District Coordinators are working closely with their local emergency management partners to assist with any unmet needs and resources.

**TDEM Mass Care:** TDEM Mass Care continues to coordinate the state-supported non-congregate shelter mission. Evacuees remain in non-congregate shelters throughout the state. TDEM is working with the state of Louisiana on the repopulation of their residents that sought shelter in Texas.

[4,798 evacuees are in shelters throughout the state in 1,999 hotel rooms at 11 non-congregate shelters.](#) TDEM is working in coordination with Louisiana on the sheltering and repopulation for their residents in Texas.

### **Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ):**

Drinking Water Systems: Drinking Water System Assessment data pulled from the Natural Disaster Operations Workgroup (NDOW) Response Manager Database as of 2:00 PM Friday, September 18, 2020.

Phone assessments are being conducted for 171 drinking water systems in seven counties including: Hardin, Jasper, Jefferson, Newton, Orange, Sabine and San Augustine.

- Of the 171 systems assessed, 160 are operational and one is operating on a generator.
- 16 systems are under a Boil Water Notice and 39 have been rescinded.

TCEQ staff are conducting weekly inspections on all of the approved Temporary Debris Management Sites (TDMS). Twelve TDMS in Newton, Orange, Sabine, and Jasper Counties have been authorized.

**Texas Military Department (TMD):** TMD currently has [130](#) activated personnel in support of the August tropical weather response. TMD is supporting multiple shelter sites with ETN operations in the DFW Metroplex Area, Austin, Spring and The Woodlands.

### **Volunteer Organizations Active in Disaster (VOADs):**

**Southern Baptists of Texas Convention (SBTC):** SBTC IMT is working out of the Liberty Baptist Church in Bridge City. [SBTC to date, has provided: 1,215 showers, 806 loads of laundry, 368 homes completed, 397 total requests received, 186 generator hours, 185 heavy equipment hours, 11,142 total meals prepared and 12,400 volunteer hours.](#)
