




## Wind Speeds







# Fire Activity (\*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 491 (no change) fires and 134,651 (no change) acres destroyed this year. There are 84 (-4) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list 101 (no change) counties with an average over 400.
