

Incoming Hurricane Delta will bring rain to Eastern Texas as it makes landfall and moves inland on Friday. The best rain chances will be in our far eastern/southeastern counties, and will become more isolated as you move back west. Skies will be mostly cloudy, but will gradually clear from west to east throughout the afternoon hours. Winds will be from the east-southeast around 5-10 MPH. Patchy fog likely to develop around daybreak generally along and west of I-35.

A Tropical Storm Warning is now in effect for Sabine, Natchitoches, Winn, Grant, La Salle, Caldwell, Jackson, and Ouachita Parishes in Northern Louisiana as well as Sabine County in Deep East Texas. Peak winds of 30 to 40 mph with gusts in excess of 60 mph will be possible late Friday Night through Saturday morning.









Keetch-Byram Drought Index



Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 505 (+1) fires and 135,138 (+40) acres destroyed this year. There are 80 (no change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list 149 (+4) counties with an average over 400.
