






Southeast to south winds around 15 mph along with minimum afternoon relative humidity values around 10 to 13 percent and receptive fuels will result in elevated fire weather conditions this afternoon through early this evening across the western Oklahoma Panhandle.




A Fire Weather Watch is in effect Sunday afternoon and early evening for the Guadalupe Mountains, southeast New Mexico, and portions of the northern Permian Basin.

Hazardous Weather



A Coastal Flood Warning in effect for the Middle Texas Coast through this afternoon. 2-3' of inundation is expected. In addition, a HIGH Risk of Rip currents is in effect through this evening and will likely be extended through the weekend.



A Coastal Flood Advisory is in effect until Noon CDT today. Nuisance flooding is expected to continue along the coast, with water reaching or pushing into the dunes on SPI. Vehicles, except those with four wheel drive and high wheel bases, will be unable to be driven on the beach. Minor to moderate beach erosion is expected.






