



Hazardous Weather



Critical fire weather conditions are expected across the entire Texas and Oklahoma Panhandles today. The highest threat area will be across the western and central Texas Panhandle where the southwest to west winds will be strongest along with the low relative humidity values and receptive fuels. A cold front will quickly approach the Oklahoma Panhandle from the north and push south across all of the area by around midnight tonight shifting the winds to the northwest and north!



Another hot day today with highs ranging from the lower 90s to near 100. Westerly winds will be gusty to windy this afternoon which may lead to some blowing dust. A Red Flag Warning is in effect from 1 PM until 8 PM tonight.

Portions of the northern Permian Basin have been added to the Red Flag Warning which includes southeast New Mexico and the Guadalupe Mountains. Very low relative humidities with strong wind gusts will cause critical fire weather conditions. Do not burn outdoors and avoid any activities that may cause a spark.

Hot, dry, and windy conditions this afternoon, will create critical fire weather conditions. A Red Flag Warning is in effect from 1 PM until 8 PM today for areas on the Caprock and adjacent Rolling Plains. Any fires that develop will have the potential to rapidly spread. Outdoor burning is discouraged.




Sunday will be dry and unseasonably hot. Afternoon high temperatures will range from the low to middle 90's east of I-35, and upper 90's into the triple digits along and west of I-35. Forecast high temperatures will likely approach or even exceed record temperatures for many locations. The record high temperature for October 11th for DFW is 99 F and was set in 1979. Waco's record high temperature for the 11th is 97 F and was set in 1989 and 1991. In addition to the heat, there are elevated fire weather concerns generally along and west of Highway 281 due to the unseasonably warm temperatures, low humidity, breezy southwest winds, and lack of recent rainfall. Avoid activities that could start fires.







Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 506 (no change) fires and 135,148 (no change) acres destroyed this year. There are 80 (no change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list 151 (+1) counties with an average over 400.
