





Showers and thunderstorms are possible this morning as a cold front moves through the region. Showers will linger throughout the day in the wake of the front. Northerly winds will pick up behind the boundary. Temps will be cooler today with highs in the upper 60s to low 70s.



A cold front moving south into Deep South Texas will bring about a cloudy, cooler and wetter Friday as the shower and thunderstorm chances increase. The high temperatures will occur this morning as the passage of the front ushers in cooler northerly winds. High temperatures will range from the upper 60s to lower 70s across the northern Ranchlands to the upper 70s to lower 80s across the lower RGV.




A High Wind Warning is in effect for Guadalupe Pass until 10 AM MDT this morning. Northeasterly winds of 30-40mph could gust up to 55 mph, resulting in hazardous driving conditions through the pass, especially for high profile vehicles. Be careful out there!




A cold front has brought cooler weather to the region and high temperatures today will be mainly in the low to mid 70s...upper 60s down to the southeast where clouds and some rain showers will linger. Elsewhere, clouds will thin from the west to east and by mid afternoon much of the area will be under partly to mostly sunny skies. North and Northeast winds will gust to over 30 mph in the morning...decreasing a bit as we get into the afternoon hours.







Fire Activity (*Last 24 Hours)

Reports 512 (+2) fires and 145,155 (+4) acres destroyed this year. There are 90 (no change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list 188 (+5) counties with an average over 400.
